For the first time in the history of Rotary International District 3830, a Virtual District Conference was held successfully last June 30. The theme was Championing Rotary's Causes in the New Normal.

The virtual parade of dignitaries and champion presidents was artistically presented, followed with a solemn Invocation by male tenors. The National Anthem showcased some of clubs' signature projects.

Virtual Discon Chairperson, CP Mache Torres-Ackerman, opened the conference with a warm welcome. She said. "No pandemic can stop us from pursuing our advocacies and She further said that purpose." the Virtual Discon was a time to "reconnect, relearn and reboot our Rotary lives in the new normal".

Mark Daniel Maloney, 2019-2020 RI President came up next. He urged Rotarians to keep learning and finding new opportunities to grow Rotary in innovative, sustainable ways.

This was followed by the State of the District Address by Champion Governor Ador Tolentino. cited the 3 Cs - Cooperation, Collaboration and Connection as the spirit that moved the Champion presidents to conceive implement their numerous projects in the six areas of focus. These also led to the success of district activities like the Pre-Pets, Distas, Handover, End Polio Day and now, Discon 2020.

With and conflict peace resolution and prevention the thrust of his term, Governor Ador gave his all out support to the Champion Presidents for the construction of the Rotary Peace Monument in Paranaque.

The Governor's Monthly Letter (GML) was rich in content as it featured articles on projects and activities of the various clubs and the district.

Membership grew from 3394 to 3722, with RC Makati EDSA bringing in a staggering 84 new members. Rotary Club of Roxas, Palawan was chartered in April 21, 2020 with 21 Charter Members.

District 3830 had the most number of Global Grants in the history of Rotary in the Philippines for a total of 38 applications in the amount of \$2.37 million

The district also gave a huge contribution of \$446,631 to The Rotary Foundation, with RC
