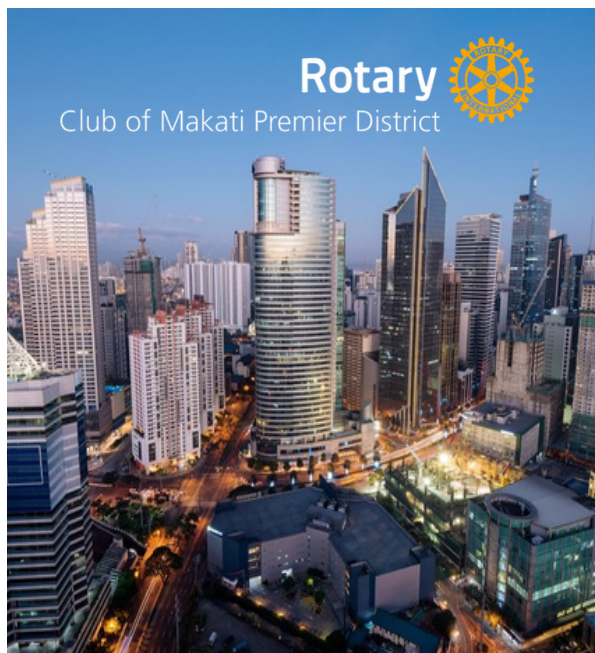

# EMPOWERING GIRLS AND WOMEN

## A Basic Human Right

Recently, I spent time in the Nakivale refugee settlement in Uganda. As the "settlement" in its name suggests, the people living there are free to move around and integrate as best they can — one thing that makes the place unique.

I had a chance to play soccer with boys and girls from about a dozen nations and talk with women who had fled areas of conflict. It was a tapestry of human experience shared through both laughter and tears.

As I walked across a school campus at the settlement with a teacher, she shared with me the dire statistics on girls' education. Most don't get through grade school. Many are sold into child marriage to pay for food for their families. As I looked around at these young girls, I was gutted.

Our work with empowering girls and women is much more than creating equity — sometimes, it's about health or education. Other times it's about providing safety. Regardless of the path, it's always about basic human rights.

We can do more to empower girls and women, and we can expand how we share the progress Rotary members and our partners have made toward this goal.

# EARLY CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT TRAINING FOR 87 CHILD CARE WORKERS

Our Pillar Grant project seeks to develop the knowledge and skills of child development workers, teachers, barangay nutrition scholars, barangay health workers, and parents who share responsibility and care for young children in early childhood development.

On Feb 8-10, we conducted a three-day training for 87 participants representing 6 barangays of Lobo, Batangas. With the assistance of the Knowledge Channel Foundation and our partners RC Makati East, RC Muntinlupa East, and RC Makati Rosewood, participants received holistic early childhood development training, including early learning simulation, nutrition and health (including oral health), social protection, growth mindset, and strategies for early childhood teachers.

Caring well for our children today secures a better future for us all!

- Child Care Development Worker.

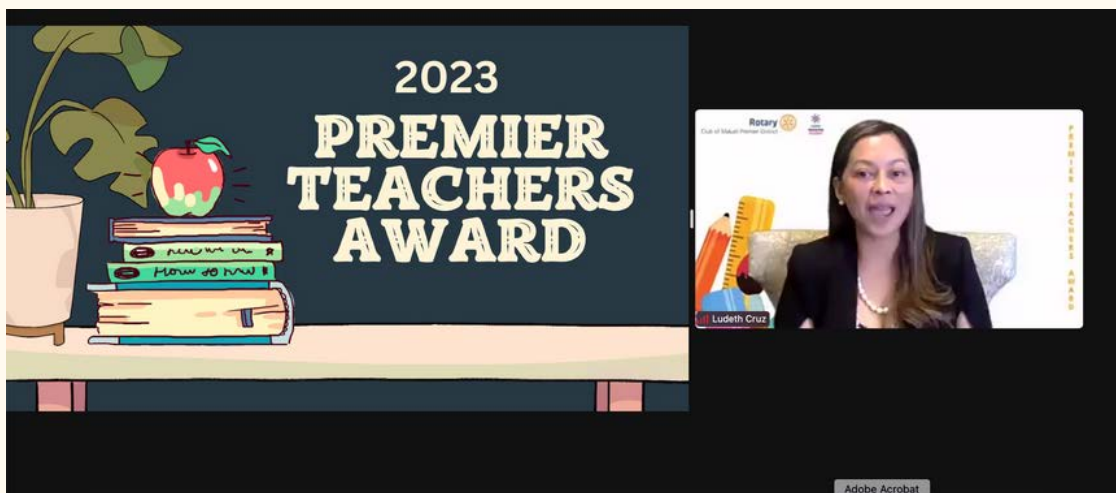

# AN INTERNATIONAL SISTER CLUB WITH ALOHA: RC HONOLULU SUNSET



This Rotary year marks a year of expanding our friendships - internationally! In November 2022, we signed an international sister club agreement with the Rotary Club of Greater Kuala Lumpur.

In February 2023, we signed our second international sister club with the Rotary Club of Honolulu Sunset (RCHS).

Chartered on December 1995, the RCHS became the first club to meet in the evenings in Hawaii. They have been very successful in developing sustainable projects both locally in Hawaii and overseas. Their overseas projects are in Romania, Papua New Guinea, Nepal, and Malawi, Africa. Locally in Hawaii, RCHS provides short and long-term support for Ala Wai Elementary and

Jefferson Elementary Schools. They also support Farrington High School and vocational scholarships to Kapiolani Community College students. RCHS works with organizations like Women in Need, US Vets, HUGS, and Ho'ola Na Pua.

To kick off our sister club agreement, RCHS has donated US\$1,500 to help support teachers in Lobo, Batangas, with reference books for teaching. We are grateful for their support!

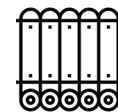

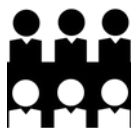

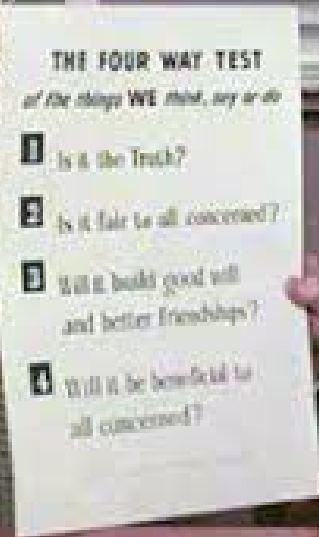

# ROTARY FUN FACT



One of the world's most widely printed and quoted statements of business ethics is the Rotary "4-Way Test." It was created by Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor in 1932 when he took charge of the Chicago-based Club Aluminum Company, which was facing bankruptcy.

Taylor sought a way to save the struggling company mired in depression-caused financial difficulties. He drew up a 24-word code of ethics for all employees to follow in their business and professional lives.

The 4-Way Test became the guide for sales, production, advertising, and all relations with dealers and customers, and the company's survival was credited to this simple philosophy.

Herb Taylor became president of Rotary International during 1954-55. Rotary adopted the 4-Way Test in 1943 and has been translated into more than 100 languages and published in thousands of ways.
