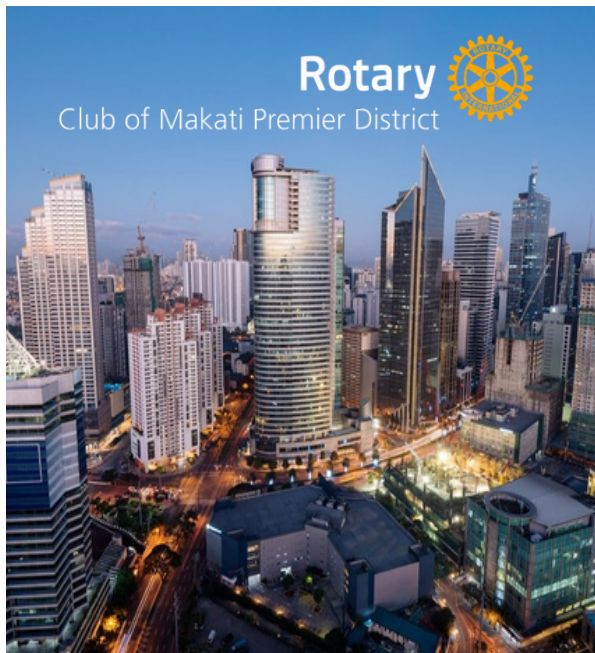

Club Induction Night

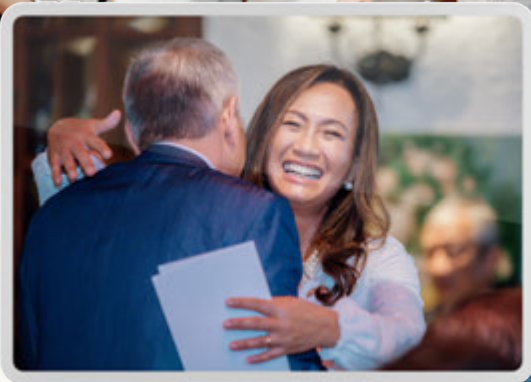
On July 4th, 2023, we celebrated the induction of our new club president, JM Yupangco.
