The ceremony was witnessed by District 3830 Top Gun Governor Jay Tambunting, and PDG/Current District Rotary Foundation Committee Chairman Al Montecillo.

On November 9, 2023, the RCMPD team comprising of Past President Raissa H. Posadas, President-Elect Eric I. Quiason, Peace & Conflict for Service Committee Annabel Uy Braganza, and the undersigned visited RCCD to meet the rest of its members, and to sign the Memorandum of Understanding in connection with a new Global Grant: Certificate Program for Upskilling Child Development Workers (CDWs) on November 12, 2023. The objective of the project was to create a comprehensive 6-month



upskilling program for child development workers (CDW), which includes, among others, mentoring, monitoring, and assessing the program's effectiveness, knowledge, and skills of the individual CDW.

With all that has transpired only in the past three months, whether fate or destiny, I describe it as "a match made in heaven."




